## LEAVE YOUR PAW PRINT

Leave your paw print will include some tips for all teachers, but especially new teachers, to enhance the outcome of a year of teaching.

As we think about getting back to school remember these three Ideas:

1st. Get to know the support staff at the school, by first name. Knowing the Custodial staff, cafeteria staff and computer person at your school is extremely important. Take the time to chat with them and really get to know them, learn about their activities, hobbies, etc, and you will get a lot farther in life. People appreciate being called by name, they enjoy knowing that you care, and once you have demonstrated both, getting things done to benefit your FFA chapter i extremely easy.

2nd. Keep your Principal in the loop. Get in a habit of talking to him/her every week to give them a heads up of what is happening. Fill them in on activities, meetings, etc. Ask them to judge or work with your speakers, invite them to come and sit in on an FFA meeting. 1. We would all like to load up our students and take them on a tour of Oregon Agriculture, but it doesn't always seem possible in these expensive times. There is how ever a solution that is extremely easy, economical, and did I mention staying in your own bed that night instead of at a campground or motel with your students. Once it is on your computer you can search for town in oregon and see satellite imaging from those areas. Check out Christmas Valley, and you'll see along with your students if you have an lcd projector the wonderful circles. (Alfalfa in a pivot.) That can lead into a great discussion about irrigation and crops based on geography. Don't for get to search close to home as well. With a few minutes of planing all of your first year ag students can see all of oregon agriculture. Make sure to include all the different types of irrigation and talk about the differences in them.
